
The Edits:


Land immediately in the user dashboard page with repositories easily viewable Get to repositories by either clicking on the repositories tab or choosing a repository from the top used section

James needs to find a classmate's code, clone it, and create a new repository mimicking it.






The Edits:


























Conclusions + next steps

Learnings

User Research is Key

-User Research allowed me to get different viewpoints about the flow of Github

Design Responses

-If users can see what an action does through either a change of color or a font weight change, the experience is much easier and less clunky

Showing All Data Fields

-The biggest issue people had with Github was that they didn't know what they could search for. With the redesign, I wanted to show that all options are available with a "Top Results" tab

Next steps

Top Navigation

-Redesign the top navigation bar (is there a better way to show what pull requests are? Is marketplace necessary?)

Explore

-For novice users, the explore function is important in discovering new things to be inspired by; to redesign the explore function so that it doesn't clog up the experience for advanced users, but still is available for novice users would be the next step. I especially want to play with the search function and finding inspiration through that.
